Martha's Trees






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based on the Martha Washington block as seen in Voices of the Past



If you are adding a border of triangles as shown, Remember: your border needs to stay on grid i.e., 4 x ----- or be willing to adjust the size of your triangles in the border

You will assemble your blocks following the above diagram. As you can see, you will also need to choose a fabric for the base of the tree. This is also the 4×10 grid. Then add connectors of this same fabric to two of the background 4×10 as shown above.

Border as desired. Add extra triangle units or experiment with options.

Have fun changing sizes, colors and even the height and width of your trees!



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
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Martha's Trees worksheet

Choose background, dark & medium

I have choosen the following grid: You an adjust as you like but remember: ADD SEAM ALLOWANCES TO THE SIZES BELOW. These are finished grid sizes.



Now, obviously if your square is 4", all you connectors would be cut $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". To make the "K" unit, I recommend you cut your half square triangle using your ruler - and you would cut it from the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. The quarter square unit would be cut from a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strip using your quarter square ruler. This is the easiest to piece.

I would scrap all the backgrounds or at least have a very busy one. This is a large unit to be too plain. All your darks can be scrappy, they just need to stay in the same value. If you add a medium, then I would use it in the A unit position as shown.
